

MARINE WORKS COMMENCING at the Port of Broome in November 2024

Marine works at the Port of Broome will commence in November 2024 in preparation for the key construction period of the Kimberley Marine Support Base (KMSB) Facility.

Contractors are currently mobilising on site, and low-level activity may be seen ahead of construction.

NOTICE TO ALL MARINE USERS

When marine works commence in November, there will be a temporary "Marine Works Zone" as indicated below in **red**.



Unauthorised personnel and vessels are NOT permitted within 50m of the marine work zones.

Special navigation markers (yellow crosses and lights) will indicate the work zones to avoid.

Foot traffic along the beach will be permitted when active work zones are a safe distance away.

About the KMSB facility

The KMSB facility has been developed to help improve Broome's economy, by increasing capacity at the Port of Broome, and allow for 24/7 operations regardless of tide depth, enabling more cruise and cargo ships to utilise the port and support Kimberley businesses.
